

The distinguishing barn on Railroad Avenue in Macedon was used to house the mules that pulled boats and cargo along the banks of the Erie Canal. The property was put up for sale. The property had no registered landmark of importance. Through the efforts of the Town Historian and the president of MHS, a resident in Macedon was able to


