The 1776 Bicentennial

Young People's BiC Play Wins Plaudits

GANANDA — A young people's play, with history brought before the footlights in GANANDA a most professional way by amateurs, brought standing ovations from the audience at Gananda School and Neighborhood Center last Thursday and Friday.

Spontaneous applause went up for the cast and writerdirector Charles Niven of a Macedon Young People's Bicentennial play. The plaudits are well deserved.

Niven, a Macedon resident, began writing the original production last summer. He gathered an energetic, hardworking cast and production staff to help him and went into rehearsal.

The effort was worth it for the play, performed without fancy costumes on a three-quarter stage decked out in as few props as possible, depended upon the playwright's words and talent of the actors. They all came through admirable as the audience's reaction showed.

Thirteen scenes, revolving around American history, heritage and customs, are included in the script. The play opens with Scene One, "A Long Time Ago" featuring American Indians and several European dances.

Scenes following depict early settlers and founders of the

nation, the revolutionaries of 200 years ago and the writing of the Declaration of Independence. Also shown, in brief sketches, are impressions of World War I and II, inventions of the 19th Century and contemporary living.

The choreography, from minuets to the twist, was exceptional, as was a solo per-formance without music of the "Star Spangled Banner" rendered by Karen Reed. A

piccolo solo by Dawn Pedersen was also exceptionally well done

The biggest scene stealer was little Nikki Wemett, in the role of sign changer announcing upcoming scenes.

Writer-producer Niven narrated the production, sponsored by Macedon's **Bicentennial** Committee. When it all was over, Niven commented back stage, "It's done and I'm glad we did it. Still, this

cast won't be repeating the play. But, it's available to anyone, or any group, to put on. The script is here for the asking and I'll help with any productions in the future. "Now, though, I'm finishing an adult bicentennial play.

Niven refers to a production which will go on stage next summer as part of Macedon's bicentennial observance.



MACEDON CENTER QUAKER CEMETERY Do you recognize any family members?

This statement was written on the original cemetery list in the Wayne County Historical / Tourism Office at Lyons, NY.:

"There are many burials in this cemetery, but according to Quaker tradition, they were buried in rows as the people died, not in families, and no stones mark their graves. Nor are there records kept. The old part of the ground is badly overgrown, almost impenetrable."

This cemetery is located in the area of Macedon township called Macedon Center. A quiet four corners where many of our ancestors were born, lived and died. Many were Quakers and lead lives in that faith. On the southeast corner, of the four corners, is a building that was the Old Quaker Meeting House. If you walk behind this building you will find the over grown area of the Cemetery. As of a few years ago there were a few tombstones standing and readable.
