

## **Members Highlight - Randy Kennard**



We are a by-product of our history, how we were shaped by moments. History is important to know and record. My mother treasured antiques and the stories around them. I became both appreciative of these old items, but only as long as they pose a purpose. While at the same time I appreciate the convenience of newer things. My appreciation of the antiques kept in my home when there is a story that enriches their value. I store my sewing fabrics in the

100-year-old steamer trunk that my grandmother and her family used when traveling from Germany to this country. Every time I look at the trunk, or remove items from it I celebrate her memory and how she touched my life. More special is that her family lived in Macedon Center and her parents are buried in the Macedon Center Cemetery.

Anytime I can see the contributions of the past and how they get us to our present time, these contributions need to be cherished and remembered. The efforts to save the buildings and the local history of Macedon Center are commendable. And, the task is a lion's amount of effort. In someway, I want to assist the process where it can fit into my life.

In my retired years, I, Randy Kennard, am enjoying different ways to create art. I have always enjoyed color and texture and how it can create a story and emotion. Seventeen years ago, I stated working with glass. Creating with fusion glass has evolved from jewelry to larger items, such as pictures and figurines. To learn more about how to make the glass pop,

I have taken art classes of any medium, oil, watercolor, pastel, and sketching. I have really discovered techniques that can be applied across all mediums. In fact, right now at the Palmyra Library's 3rd floor gallery I have a show where for each glass item, there is a corresponding painting. I invite you to check it out. ## Mary Kay Ricks - "Escape on the Pearl"

**MACEDON** — The Macedon Historical Society, in partnership with the 1816 Farmington Quaker Meetinghouse Museum, AKWAABA, and the Frederick Douglas Initiative, held an interesting lecture Oct. 7 that was attended by about 50 people.

Mary Kay Ricks, an author and lawyer from Washington, D.C., shared a presentation on an amazing family that had ties to our area. Ricks is the author of "Escape on The Pearl: The Heroic Bid for Freedom on The Underground Railroad." She shared the history of Mary and Emily Edmonson, who fled slavery in Washington, D.C., and, with the help of local abolitionists, eventually found their way to Macedon. They lived with local Quakers and attended a Quaker school before returning to teach in a District of Columbia school for Black children.

The following is borrowed, with permission from Mary Kay Belant, president of the 1816 FQMH Museum:

"On April 15, 1848, abolitionists executed a plan to free over 70 people enslaved by families in Washington, D.C. The freedom seekers were to travel aboard The Pearl, sail down the Potomac River and up Chesapeake Bay, landing in the free state of New Jersey. Forced by weather conditions to anchor overnight, the ship and people were caught by agents of 'owners.' The recaptured freedom seekers were

then sold to slave marketers in the Deep South, setting a fearful example for others in D.C.

"Mary and Emily Edmonson, sisters aged about 15 and 13, two of 14 children of a free father and enslaved mother, were sold to slave agents in New Orleans. After about six months awaiting a possible fate of sale into sexual slavery, they were freed by funds raised by their father, Paul Edmonson, with help from northern churches and abolitionist agent, William Chaplin. They moved immediately to the Farmington-Macedon community in central New York. There, they lived with Quakers William R. Smith and Eliza Smith.



Nearby, Cassandra Green Hamblin, Hannah C. Smith, Phebe Hathaway, Maria E. Wilbur, and Anna P. Adams set up a Quaker school, locally known as the 'Bird's Nest School,' attended by Mary and Emily. Harriet Beecher Stowe, whose famed novel, "Uncle Tom's Cabin," was inspired by the Pearl incident, helped support their education.



"William R. Smith and other Farmington-Macedon Quakers continued to organize and cooperate with local and regional abolitionist and Underground Railroad networks. They provided material and logistical support for escaping freedom seekers, securing funds for purchasing freedom and for legal expenses, including bail. Quaker values and training fostered a sense of mission, purpose, and obligation to continuous work to abolish slavery."

The Macedon Historical Society hosted this event utilizing the auditorium of the historic Macedon Academy in Macedon Center,

streaming live to a television and speaker on the first floor.



# Henning Family adds to the collections at the Macedon Academy Museum

This is a view finder from the Henning Family, Emma & William Henning, which are Roger & Ken Hennings' grandparents. This may or may not be from the Holmes version. History indicates, in

1861 Oliver Wendell Holmes created and deliberately did not patent a handheld, streamlined, much more economical viewer than had been available before. The stereoscope, which dates from the 1850s, consisted of two prismatic lenses and a wooden stand to hold the stereo card. This type of stereoscope remained in production for a century and there are still companies making them in limited production currently. *Historical information from WikipediA*
