APHNYS (Association of Public Historians New York State) Region 11 Conference in Macedon, New York.

On April 20, 2024, 29 historians and history enthusiasts from around our region met at the Macedon Town Complex.

The Association of Public Historians New York State, Region 11 holds a conference on a yearly basis. Did you know that all communities are required by law to have a designated historian? This year, Linda Braun, the Macedon Town Historian agreed to host the event. Assistance was received from Gene Bavis-Walworth Historian, Rosa Fox – Town of Huron Historian, Jane Milem – Wayne County Historian and Babette Huber – Town of Victor Historian and APHNYS Regional Coordinator.

One of our goals was to share information on how to prepare for the United States Semiquincentennial Celebration in 2026. We also heard from a variety of speakers. **Babette Huber** shared activities that New York State has taken to promote our upcoming 250th birthday. We also shared ideas on how to plan for this event.

Dr. Michael Oberg, Distinguished Professor of History at SUNY Geneseo shared his program, the *Semiquincentennial Student Fellowship Project* funded by the Gardiner Foundation. https://historyatgeneseo.org/ It was so exciting to hear about ways he is encouraging students from all academic disciplines to get involved in history projects near their hometowns.

Erika Newcombe, a local college student and Pal-Mac Graduate (Class of 2023) shared the work that she has been doing on the Old Baptist Cemetery located on Walworth Rd. What began as a Girl Scout Gold project has transformed into a passion that she and her mother work on together. Erika is working hard to locate, identify and restore some of the headstones in this pioneer cemetery. One of her most exciting finds was of Hannah Harwood, wife of Webb Harwood a couple of Macedon's first settlers. She also located the gravestone of Betsey Brister, the wife of Aaron Brister a former slave and entrepreneur in Palmyra. Erika shared the journey with a room full of adult historians and enthusiasts. She is a remarkable young woman, and we are VERY pleased with the progress she has made with this project. During a special luncheon with meals created by <u>The Local Farm Table's</u> chef Averie Riel, we heard from **Gene Bavis**, Walworth Historian. Gene shared the work that the Wayne Historians Organization does, including the work we did

It is a wonderful resource created by local historians. The site has been designed and maintained by Jim Paprocki. We encourage everyone to explore the site.

Chris Blomgren, a Social Studies teacher for 30 years shared the concepts and strategies that his business *Historic Pursuits* uses to help teach, engage, and inspire young people. His hands on approach to learning was contagious! Check out his offerings at https://www.historicpursuits.org/.

Our last presenter was **Ann Morton**, archaeologist, and owner of Morton's Archaeological Services. Her business is a Cultural Resource Survey firm mortonarchaeology.com/. Ann's program titled Archeology 101 was designed to show the lay person what to look for when investigating or coming upon historic sites. She shared several different excavations that she has worked on and explained how things work when they begin discovering artifacts.

The afternoon concluded with questions and answers. Everyone seemed to have a fabulous day and enjoyed sharing ideas especially their love of history with others. We look forward to getting together again next year!



Celebration of Nettie's Birthday

On Saturday, March 23rd approximately 80 people from Macedon and the surrounding area took advantage of a rare opportunity to see inside the historic Bullis House located on Canandaigua Rd.

Our gracious host, Mr. Jeffrey Henley, allowed us to walk around this

cobblestone home that was completed in 1842. Our



open house included a birthday celebration for a local benefactor, Miss. Nettie Bullis. She would have been 131 years old on that day. My apologies to those who read my previous article where I incorrectly wrote 101 years!

The patriarch Charles Bullis was born in Manchester, Vermont in 1786. He married his wife Eleanor in 1812. In 1839 they moved to New York and settled in Macedon. From 1841 to 1979, four generations of the Bullis family lived in their cobblestone home which is listed on the National Register.

Some of the more amazing things we learned were that the home did not have any electricity, plumbing or heat, other than a fireplace until 1980! Nettie lived in a trailer outside of the home where her brother Charlie resided. A couple of folks visiting recalled Charlie. Mr. Maxwell remembered how he used to sometimes drive Charlie places. Judy

Snyder of Palmyra shared that her mother-in-law Rosalie cooked and played cards with Nettie the last couple years of her life.

The house is just beautiful! It is my understanding that when cobblestone homes were built it took approximately 3 years. This was due to the need for the cement and stones to set properly. This home was built between 1839 and 1842. It is

a Federal style, cobblestone house consisting of a 2-story main block with a 1½-story frame wing. It is constructed of irregular, rough, moderate sized cobbles.

The house is among the approximately 170 surviving cobblestone buildings in Wayne County. Did you know that Wayne County New York is the home to 20% of the cobblestone buildings in the world?

The cobblestone design is characterized by rows of rough, rounded field stones of irregular shape and moderate size, and separated by horizontal mortar joints in the shape of a projecting V-shape. While most cobblestone structures had quoins and lintels of limestone or sandstone, the Charles Bullis House is one of only eight cobblestone buildings in Wayne

County with brick quoins and lintels.

The interior of the house has been well preserved. The fireplace, with its white mantel and stone hearth is simply beautiful. Mr. Henley has a very large, framed map of Wayne County hung above it. The floors are wide planks with square nails.

What I found most stunning were the windows. Because of the thickness of the

exterior walls, the windows were designed so that their interior frames were angled. This allows the light to fill the room in a very special way.

It was noted that all of the hardware on the doors was original. The cen-

ter staircase had what I believe to be marble inlay in the null post. The railing was shorter than those required with today's standards. The staircase was open at the top allowing access to four rooms on the second floor.

Macedon is indebted to Nettie Bullis for her generous contributions. We encourage anyone who is interested in preserving our history to check out the Macedon Historical Society (MHS). The MHS owns and maintains two buildings in Macedon Center, the Macedon Academy and the Macedon Center


